Raising Children to Carry On Wagogo Culture

In Chamwino, Tanzania, there is a community-led organization of Wagogo villagers, including farmers, cow-herders, and shop-keepers, who hope to raise their children to know and carry on Wagogo culture. Dr. Kedmon Mapana, now Executive Secretary of the National Arts Council of Tanzania, established the Chamwino Arts Center (CAC) 15 years ago to ensure that, despite the presence of cultural influences from Europe, North America, South Africa, and elsewhere, Wagogo heritage will
